open. Churches close. Opening and growing for the Last 16 years makes us believe that God is with us. Shrinking or closing makes us believe that something went wrong.

In the plant world, things grow. Things die. When a tree reaches full maturity, it begins a dying process which brings new life to the forest. We are at peace with the process that we learned in school. We are fine talking about life and death in terms of plants, but not about churches. What am I saying? Is our church dying? No. Don't be alarmed, or better yet, fear not. But I am saying that First Presbyterian Ocala has been changing for some time now. We tend to measure our churches by membership, which is funny when you think about it. One can be a member of a church and not be particularly involved, and one can be particularly involved without being a member. But we hold membership with great reverence, so much, in fact, that we tend not to revise the number of members as frequently as we should because we only want to see church membership grow. We believe that a growing church, or at least a stable one, is a healthy and happy church. But the rolls were being "cleansed" during the time I arrived, and the membership "dropped" from 909 believers to about 650. Now the church is shrinking/has shrunk. Now we are asking what went wrong. What is God up

I am not convinced that anything went wrong at all, but I am convinced some things changed. Our denomination answered questions it had struggled with for decades. Some left who did not appreciate the outcome of that struggle. On the local level, ministers came and went, but this always happens. Something else happened to make the church smaller, and I'm not sure what. I have my own measurement, which is hardly scientific, to measure a church's health, namely, attendance on Easter Sunday. Christmas has so many people coming and going, but by and large, Christians try to be in "their" church on Easter Sunday, whether they are members or not.

This data, though kept with the best intentions, is probably a bit flawed, but, we can assume, generally accurate. If graphed, it would show that the church "peaked" in attendance about ten years ago. Attendance tells the story of how many people came to church. I will say this about the 423 souls who attended Easter Sunday of 2017. They are committed, and this is good.

Attendance is no way to measure the success or failure of a church when we are talking about the church and its mission. Our benevolences grew every year over this period. New ministries began. The love of Christ was known. God was worshiped in many powerful ways. But all who love this church and what it stands for want to see new growth. If we go back to the plant world, we know that one way to bring on new and better growth is pruning. The church has been pruned, a painful but perhaps necessary process. Only God knows.

Are we ready for what comes next? Our Session is going on a retreat to Epworth by the Sea in St. Simons Island, GA January 4-6. Ruth Elswood, our outgoing Parish Associate, has graciously agreed to conduct services for us that Sunday here in Ocala. We will be spending the first weekend of the new year together as a Session, planning a new roadmap for our church, one that I hope will bring new growth. Let's be clear: our growth needs to be spiritual (becoming closer to God) which is very difficult to measure. Something good happens when people feel like they are growing spiritually in their church. If this and only this is achieved, everything else will surely follow according to God's divine will.

We look Forward to a New Year of Music that Unites our Hearts together in Christ!

Did you know that as we sing together in worship, we literally become one in heart? Researchers in Sweden studied the heart rates of choir members as they sang together. Their findings published in Frontiers in Neuroscience explain how heart rates become synchronized when people sing together.

The researchers measured the changes in the choir members' heart rates. When the choir began to sing, their heart rates slowed down.



And they learned it takes almost no time at all for singers' heart rates to become synchronized. As people sing together their heart rates fall into a shared rhythm guided by the song's tempo!
