

Fifth in our series on the PC(USA) seal: The Fish

The seal of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) is a symbolic statement of the church's heritage, identity, and mission in contemporary form. Its power depends on both its simplicity and complexity, as well as its traditional and enduring qualities.

Looking more closely at some of the visual components of the design, viewers may discover elements that seem to fuse with some of the more obvious theological symbols. In the shape of the descending dove, for example, one might also discern in the body of the bird, the form of a fish, an early-Christian sign for Christ, recalling his ministry to those who hunger.

Security Update

Almost 2 years ago a meeting was hosted by the First Baptist Church of Ocala to address Church Security. Seventeen of our members joined with 120 others from many churches in our area. There we were introduced to staff from Strategos International a leading company in providing training in Church Security. All were there because of concern about the increasing number of violent acts against places of worship.

Following the two-day training by Strategos FPC organized a Security Committee chaired by Elder John Reiss. We developed a mission statement which reads: "Develop a security ministry that provides for the comfort, peace, and protection of First Presbyterian Church members, visitors, and staff during attendance at worship services, other church sponsored functions, and office hours".

The major types of incidents that our Security Committee is concerned about include: Medical Events, Fire Evacuation, Active Shooter

Something to remember is that our Security program does not replace First Responders or Law Enforcement....We buy time for our Church Family until the First Responders and Law Enforcement arrive, once they arrive they take over.

Who is security ? How do we identify them ? Both good questions. First, our security team wears small lapel pins. Secondly some are wearing ear pieces that indicate two way radios, and finally all ushers are security members. Important IF YOU SEE SOMETHING...SAY SOMETHING.

What has the Security Committee Accomplished?

- Held monthly meeting to plan strategy
- Attended various trainings to enhance capabilities either individually or in groups
- Provided 1st training at FPC on "Situational Awareness" and Exterior Security which was attended by 30 interested members
- Planned 2nd training is scheduled for 10/26/19 @9:00AM to teach basic first aid, CPR (technique not to receive certification), the AED Defibrillator, and Oxygen tank use to be taught by John Heinbockel and Debbie Koch
- Controlled access by securing specific doors after services begin and unlocking prior to end of service while directing those arriving late to the main entrance door(s) that will always remain unlocked
- Expanded Video capability/coverage of church campus which is monitored during office hours by volunteer in office and during worship by Security

Finally what's next ?

Additional Security Staff Training, Drills including Evacuation, Review of Security plans and perhaps an external audit of plans by local Law Enforcement, Laminated info cards attached to wall next to all phones to provide instructions and address info to be used in case of emergency call.



Mission Trip to Puerto Rico with Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

Hurricane Maria was a deadly Category 5 hurricane that devastated Dominica, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico in September 2017. It is regarded as the worst natural disaster in recorded history to affect those islands. FPC is in the planning stages of a mission trip to Puerto Rico from (tentatively) May 26-June 3, 2020. We will provide non-skilled and semi-skilled labor (though skilled is great too!) and work out of El Guacio, a Presbyterian Camp and Conference Center in San Sebastian, Puerto Rico. If you are interested in taking this journey, email the pastor or call the church office. We hope to have up to 15 workers and may partner with other local PCUSA congregations to achieve this. The minimum age to take the trip is 15. There is no maximum age! We need people to sign up by calling the church office. We also need a lay leader who will make the journey.


